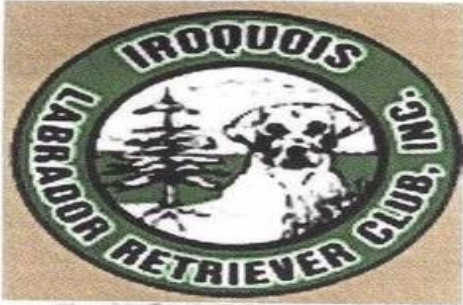

Welcome to our Member Spotlight. Each newsletter will help you get to know one member of KLRC. This month we get to meet yours truly:

Kathy LaFrana

My life with the Labrador Retriever started in 1985. I acquired a male yellow puppy from Dennis Livesay of Amberfield Kennels in New Jersey. A year before that my long time high school friend introduced me to dog shows and I got hooked but she breeds and shows basset hounds and I knew they were not my breed. Another friend had a lab and I loved her so I wanted to start out with labs. Boy, did I make the right decision.

Wetlands Amberfield Sandman ("Magic") as my puppy was later named, became my constant companion and best friend and my Heart dog. I was introduced to so many things and I wanted to try them all. We started with conformation and obedience. Magic excelled at everything. He was just so smart and had such a desire to please that I could teach him anything. I put 6 points on him myself in the breed ring both here and in Canada. I also showed him in obedience in Canada and he actually earned a High In Trial up there from the Novice class. I also did field work with him. He loved that too. He earned his WC and then went on to get his AKC Junior Hunter title and NAHRA Started Dog title (I think that is what it was called.. That was a long time ago). He ended up with an American and Canadian CDX but never got his UD because he could no longer jump those huge heights anymore. He could do all the Utility exercises.. He just could not jump 36 inches anymore. (That was back when AKC was insane with their jump heights). We also did some Agility and Flyball but we didn't compete in these.

I lost Magic in 1997 at the age of 12 due to canine wobblers. It was and still is the worse day of my life. I could no longer attend any dog shows or events without turning into a basket case so I quit the dog show scene. I had just gotten married and decided to pursue another one of my dreams, horses. Since my husband was afraid of the normal size horse we ended up buying a farm and getting miniature

horses. I started breeding and showing them and had a lot of fun doing it. After I lost Magic I did get another lab. Her name was Vixen. She didn't like anything except Agility so I worked with her there. We had fun but I could never run fast enough to keep up with her so we never competed. After Vixen passed I got a male puppy from Gladys Rogers of Snowden Hill kennel. Stormy was gorgeous and would have easily finished his championship had it not been for all his heath problems at an early age. He ended up being a couch potato but I loved him just the same.

Which brings me up to the present. As most of you know I now have WhisperingPines Zen's Magic Spell (Mello) from John and Barb Sebalusky. He is as smart as Magic was and so far he has 6 titles at the end of his name. I was finally able to go back into the dog world without breaking down... (how many years did that take??) I am no longer breeding or showing the horses but I still have 4 of them.

I've now started Mello in Nosework. It is a fun and new thing to do with my dog. I plan to keep doing new and fun things with my Mello for as long as we can. We hope to see club members at a dog show soon! Now that you know me, come up and say Hi!

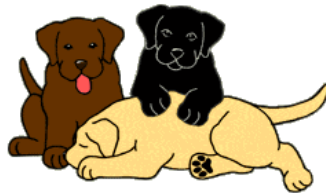

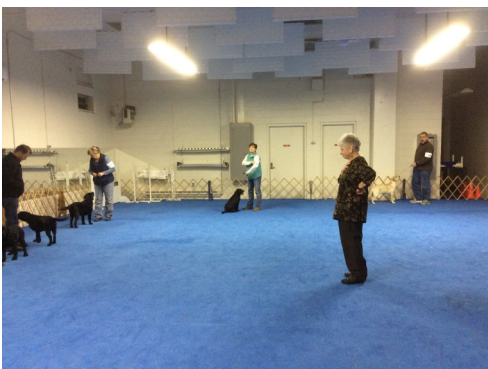
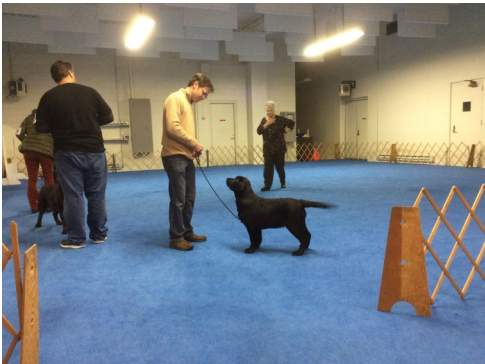

AKC Announces new sanctioned dog sport: AKC Scent Work

The American Kennel Club, the leading authority on dogs, is pleased to announce the launch of its newest sport, AKC Scent Work. Scent Work is a sport that mimics the task of working Detection Dogs - such as narcotics dogs or explosives dogs - to find a specific scent and communicate to the handler that the scent has been found. It is a positive, challenging activity that allows dogs the opportunity to use their strongest natural sense in a way that is fun, engaging, and that builds and strengthens a foundation of trust between the handler and the dog.



In AKC Scent Work the dog is searching in a pre-defined search area for the hidden odor, which is either an essential oil or handler scent, depending on the class. Searches take place in a variety of environments, including an area with Containers, Interior, Exterior, and Buried. There are four difficulty levels for each element—Novice, Advanced, Excellent, and Master—and factors such as the size of the search area, the number of hides, whether the number of hides is known or unknown to the handler, and the maximum height of the hides will change with the difficulty level. The most accomplished dogs will also be eligible for The Detective Class, which contains many hides in a variety of environments.

All dogs (purebred and mixed breeds) can participate provided they are AKC-registered, enrolled with AKC Canine Partners, listed in the Purebred Alternative Listing (PAL) program or recorded in the Foundation Stock Service (FSS) program.

“We have already received significant interest from clubs, participants, and potential judges,” said Stephanie Kennerley, Sports and Events Project Coordinator in charge of Scent Work. “Scent Work provides a stimulating activity for dogs. Owners will enjoy watching their dogs use their nose to solve these unique puzzles. We are excited to make this activity a new AKC sport.”

Because of the tremendous interest, the sport will be ramped up in phases. The AKC is currently accepting applications from existing and new clubs seeking to become licensed to hold Scent Work trials. Approved clubs are being notified and Scent Work will be added to their club profiles beginning May 1. Applications are also being accepted for Scent Work judges. A judge’s education class is under development and is tentatively scheduled to be available by May 1. A list of approved judges will be available on the AKC website after June 1. Processing of event applications will begin on August 1. Scent Work trials can be held on or after October 1, 2017.

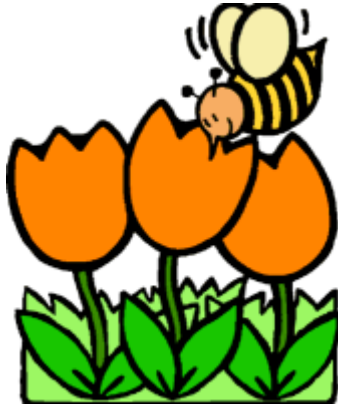

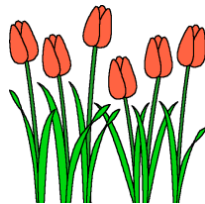
